Aim:	<p>This qualification will prepare learners to be able to support young people who have mental health problems.</p>
Course Objectives:	<p>Learners will learn:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Issues that affect young people who are have mental health problems • How youth work can support young people who have mental health problems, both directly and through partnership working and signposting • Evaluate their own youth work role in relation to supporting young people with mental health problems
